



### **Aggregate Competition.**

The aggregate competition will be conducted over all Victorian domestic competitions with the exception of the State Championships. It will be across all grades.

The aggregate competition is to provide recognition to swimmers who continually perform at a high level during the season rather than just occasionally compete.

The winner of the aggregate competition will be the person who has the highest aggregate score after the last competition. The aggregate score will be the sum of the three best scores obtained during the season on three separate days.

All scores will be to a baseline maximum of 100. Where there is only a figure competition 100% of the figure score will be used. Where there is a figure and routine competition, the score will comprise 50% figures and 50% routines. If the competition comprises figures, technical routine and free routine then the score shall be 25% figures, 25% technical routine and 50% free routine. When a swimmer is part of a duet, then the routine scores for the duet will be used with the individual figure score to obtain the score to be used for the aggregate. When a swimmer is a member of a team, then the team routine scores will be used with the individual figure score to obtain the score to be used for the aggregate. If a swimmer swims a Solo, Duet and Team on the same competition day, only one score will contribute to their aggregate, the highest as computed from the results.

On days when there is a routine competition, swimmers must participate in both the figures and the routine to obtain an eligible score.

Where Age Group swimmers also swim at the Open level, only the figure score for the same level as the routine will be used. E.g – a Junior swimmer swims the Open team and also does a Junior Duet. In finding the score to be used for the aggregate, the Junior figures are combined with the duet score and the Open Team who swim Junior figures also.

A trophy will be awarded annually for each specific category.

In Grades 5, 4, 3, 2 and 1 age limits do not apply.
